Executive Session of Council was conducted on October 26, 2020 for police, personnel, and legal issues.

It's Deputy Chief Bob Brown this evening.

We're here to give you our report for the month of October.

For the month of October, we had a total of 38 fire calls. We had one structure fire, one electrical condition, one vehicle accident, four natural gas leaks, five good intent calls, six $C O$ alarms, and 20 fire alarms, for a total of 38 for the month of October.

The Chief put together a little recap for the last three years for our calls running from January 1st through October 31st. In the year 2018, we had a total of 458 calls during that time frame. Last year, in 2019, we had 530. And this year, in the unique year of 2020, we had a total of 394 . So our volume was down.

And talking a little about the surrounding companies, it holds true to form for everywhere. Initially, when it all started, we thought it was going to be up. But I think people were -- they just didn't do anything. So, in turn, it reduced our call volume down a little bit.

A couple other items. A week ago, we turned the clocks back. Hopefully everybody remembered to change the smoke detector batteries and carbon monoxide batteries. If you didn't, just a general reminder to go ahead and do that.

And, finally, we will have Christmas coming up, so be sure when you put your decorations up, use the proper extension cords, watch how many strands you run together, and just be real safe during the holiday season.

And I'll also, like Chief O'Connor, in wishing everybody a happy Thanksgiving and upcoming holiday season.

As 2020 comes to a close, we have certainly reflected on how the Coronavirus has impacted our community. And, more importantly, we need to remember the generosity, commitment, and compassion shown by our residents, businesses, and community organizations as they work together to keep our community safe and strong.

While we bore the brunt of this worldwide pandemic together, we've remained vigilant, and we must not let our guard down. Please keep doing what you're doing out there to protect yourself and your neighbors.

As we look back on 2020, there have been so many positive highlights and things that we've accomplished as a community, including food drives, mask drives, blood drives, flu shot clinics, (inaudible) about the fundraiser, and community outreach projects to benefit those in need in Bethel Park.

We ramped our recreation summer camp program
to partner with a local childcare center to create a safe summer program so children can return to work - I'm sorry -- so parents can return to work and so their children can be safe. We modified how we ran our recreations programs to ensure the safety and well-being of our residents.

Recently, we conducted a Halloween parade, which may become a new Bethel Park tradition. We're still working on that one. We ran a Bethel Park Kindness Project recognizing those who have shown acts of kindness in our community during this challenging time.

And, please, as we move into 2021 , we may not know the challenges we'll encounter, but rest assured, we will meet these changing needs of our community. Our partnerships will continue to flourish with our community leaders, organizations, businesses, and residents to help whenever and wherever we can.

If you remember, one of my early goals was to run every road in Bethel Park in my first year. Well, Coronavirus got -- came along and kind of shortened my -- or extended that time frame. But $I$ can now say $I^{\prime} v e$ run every road in our community with only just a couple of exceptions. Those are a little
difficult to run down.
If you see me jogging through your
neighborhoods, please come on out and say hi, run with me, get a bike, let me know what's going on in your neighborhood. Please, I would like to see those. I would like to hear them.

And in closing this, $I$ have one special
treat tonight. Can you please come up here,
Ms. Dolinar?

I'd like to highlight one special Municipal
employee. She's going to hate me for this tomorrow. But this is the individual right here who planned, resourced, and executed our Halloween parade. I would like to say thank you.

PRESIDENT MOURY: I'll briefly give a summary overview. We have good news, and we have good news tonight. The good news is the Municipal Millage Rate, which we'll be voting on next, is staying the same. And, also, the other good news is, our sewer rates are actually going to be staying the same in this budget that we're adopting.

We're going to continue to monitor the sewer rates, as we talked last month. We did do a bond issue
recently. But we believe that we will be okay at least for the next several months, and no increase will be needed.

As far as the Municipal Budget goes for 2021, I would like to thank Lisa, our new Finance Director, and Mr. McLean, and everybody that spent a lot of time. As one of my former colleagues on Council used to say, "The budget's a guideline." Well, this year, it's truly a guideline.

We're going to finish up, we don't know financially. We're going to be down a little bit in collections on earned income tax. We're still tabulating where we're finishing on the property taxes. But what we've done since the pandemic, we have cut back on some of the things. Not the essentials. But some of the other things where we felt, in 2020, we could cut back. We're budgeting flat revenues for 2021. There's a lot of uncertainty out there.

But the budget does include a few key things. The Road Program is going to continue at the level. And we'll be voting on going out to bid here in a -- in a few minutes. But the infrastructure, we're going to spend a little bit of money on the IT. It's
something desperately needed. And that's probably going to be the number one thing we're going to do in 2021. We're also going to, you know, continue to update our facilities and our equipment.

But, rest assured, we're going to continue to monitor our spending and monitor our revenues. If we have a light winter, it may open up to be able to do everything we budgeted.

Just because it's in the budget doesn't necessarily mean we're going to do it. We're going to keep a very close eye, Lisa and Mr. McLean, on where we are in the revenue side, where we finish up 2020.

So our adopting it tonight, and there's a lot of good things with recreation, road programs, and equipment. Stay tuned month by month, because we're going to look at everything on a monthly basis to make sure that we have the sufficient revenues to cover our expenses.

MR. O'BRIEN: I would like to talk about the Halloween parade. If $I$ had to sum up with one word, it would be "brilliant." In a time that is so difficult, so misunderstood, so questionable, a group of people decided to think outside the box, decided to find a way to reach out to the people of Bethel Park in a way that's never been done before based on an idea of the Easter parade with Mr. Moury.

Mrs. Dolinar, this is just -- this is just the best.

Lawrence and Tim, it was outstanding.

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And to come up with an idea like this is one thing. But the monumental scale of this, the planning, the painting of the pumpkins on the street -- which they wouldn't let me have the stencil or the spray paint, which I wouldn't let me have it either -- and to process all this, along with Dave Cable.

And if $I$ forgot somebody, I'm so sorry.
But to put off two separate parades, running all over town, and trying to let people know when it was coming so they could be there, the people were very, very, very pleased and very happy with this effort.

And an individual to go raise all that money. And $I$ know we ran out of candy. But it's just like filling a salt truck up at the beginning of the route; sometimes you make it and sometimes you don't, depending on how much snow.

I'd just like to say thank you.
And then on Tuesday, we had an election. And my ward that $I$ represent, the Sixth Ward, had a unique problem. All the districts were at one place. So at 7:00 in the morning, it was absolutely bedlam.

I went up to the polling place and I seen police cars everywhere on the street. And I said, "Oh, this must not be that good. Something in going on."

And I called Mr. Moury, and he was in touch.
And it all worked out because people,

So she's my person of the week in the Sixth ward. I never met the young lady before. But that was -- that was wonderful.

Now I'll move on to something else. Our good friends at the South Hills Elks, they have been with us during this pandemic, and they're doing some good work again.

This Wednesday, November 11th, between 3:00 and 8:00, they're offering free dinners either to take out or in for veterans. Anyone who accompanies a veteran, they will be asked for a $\$ 10$ donation for the dinner.

And then they're going one better. On
Thursday, 26 th -- Thursday, the 26 th, 2020 , the lodge will be doing Thanksgiving dinners to families in our community at no charge. All dinners will just be to-go. And they ask people to be considerate because, you know,
they only can make so many dinners. If you -- you have to make reservations for this, so let them know.

And last but not least, of course, it's Veterans Day this Thursday, as the Chief so graciously reminded us. The veterans -- this Wednesday, the Veterans Memorial is -- is beautiful. It's cleaned up very nicely. The flags are all honoring all services. And our good friends at Dupree's Nursery out in Finleyville, they donated all the mums in honor of our veterans for Veterans Day.
