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PRESIDENT MOURY: Here.
MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. O'Brien?
MR. O'BRIEN: Present.
PRESIDENT MOURY: At this time, we have all members of Council present.

At this time, $I$ would like to turn to the Reports of the Officials, and the Library Director's Report.

MS. McINTOSH: Hi. Good evening. This is Christine McIntosh, the Director of your public library, where we provide opportunities to explore, learn, create, and connect.

Some of you may have seen some activity going on at the library. During the yellow phase of the Governor's COVID-19 plan, the library has been providing curbside pickups and returns. And now that Allegheny County has moved into the green phase, the library will be open to the public for limited hours beginning Monday, June 15 .

Hours of operation will be Monday through Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and Friday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

Masks are required to enter the Municipal Building and while in the library. Children under the age of 2 or those with a medical condition are exempt.

High touch areas such as counters and tables will be disinfected regularly during operating hours. And hand sanitizer is available throughout the library for you to use.

Public computers will be available for use, but are limited to one hour per day to accommodate as many as people as possible. All the toys and games in our family Place area have been removed. And furniture has been reconfigured to maintain social distancing practices. Our study rooms are available, but we are limiting to two people in a room at a time.

As we are limited in capacity, we are asking all patrons who visit to conduct their transactions and not linger in the library so that we can accommodate as many people as possible during our operating hours.

You may return library materials in the outside book-drops at any time 24 hours a
day. All returned materials will be quarantined for a minimum of 72 hours before being checked in.

So if you check your account, you'll notice they're still on there. Don't worry, they will be taken off your account after the quarantined phase, and no fines arecharged during that time.

We'll still offer curbside pickup for those of you who are not comfortable coming into the library. So you could call the library and request items that are located in our collection only. We cannot request and receive materials from other libraries in Allegheny County at this time.

Bethel Park Public Library is one of a few, three that $I$ know of, of the 70 library outlets in Allegheny County that is opening to the public at this time.

Please understand that all the
services to which you have become accustomed may not yet be available.

All classes and clubs will be on pause for the summer and will not be meeting at the library.

We do ask for your patience and your support of these new rules and regulations that we must follow as we work to provide you the best library service that we can at this time.

That is all $I$ have this evening.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Here. Good - good evening everyone.

Since we are going back into -- we're back in this green phase, some of our police services are back open at the Municipal Building at our offices.

Our record room is back open, if someone needs to pick up a report in person. Although we still encourage people to do it by
mail.
Our prescription drug box is open.
So if you need to drop off prescription drugs for disposal, you can do that again. Our property room is open. So if we were holding people's property, we will release it now. Contact the evidence custodian.

Our Crime Watch meeting is still postponed. So follow us on Facebook, and we will put a lot of updates up there as we can. And that's all I have.

PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much, Chief.

MR. USELMAN: Good evening. This is Rob Uselman with the Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company. I'm the Assistant Chief.

For the Incident Report for May of 2020, last month we had 25 calls. And the breakdown is as follows:

We had four structurefires, ten fire alarms, two Co alarms, one burnt food, one


mulch fire, one odor investigation, three good intent, one wires down, one assist medics, one gas odor investigation. On that note, that was the Incident Report.

So, I would like to say one other
thing. As we head towards one of the great holidays of this country, July 4, people will be lighting and playing with fireworks. Please use common sense. Follow the ordinances of Bethel Park and Allegheny County. And please be safe as we head into this wonderful holiday.

MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you, Mr. Moury.
I just want to go over a couple things that $I$ mentioned last week. The one thing is, all of our parks and fields are open. The Public Works Department has invested significant time and energy into
making sure our that residents and our
athletic association can utilize the fields
now for practice and for games.
Each of our parks will have signs on
them. Our residents need to continue social distancing. And for our parents, we recommend that they bring their own seating rather than using the bleachers.

We will primarily be using the Community Center for Summer Fun 2020 program, which $I$ understand started today. And that will be through June, July, and August. And because of that, regular center hours and programs are on hold until the end of August. Hopefully, weekend rentals begin in July. This (inaudible/poor reception) was made to assist local parents (inaudible/poor reception) and to give our staff time to evaluate their procedures to reopen up, not only the Center for daily use, but for all the safe programs that they will offer.

And, finally, the only thing that $I$ have was, road construction started today on Route -- or, actually, yesterday, on Route 88 (inaudible/poor reception issue) Clifton.

That will be closed from June 7 until June 13 . And the other project begins June 15. And that will go through the end of December. And that is widening or putting turning lanes on South Park Road at Logan.

So they'll be working on those daily
between 9:00 and 3:00. And that will be a long project. The ones down at
(inaudible/poor reception) Clifton, that will be a week. And then they'll take time off to replace the bridge. And then a few more weeks, that project will be done.

So that's my report this evening.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Yes, Mr. Moury. I have one comment from a resident. Or, actually, a law firm speaking out on behalf of
a resident. His name is Mr. JJ Bolock. And he represents Mr. John Murphy.

It reads as follows: "To the Bethel
Park Council members: My name is JJ Bolock and along with Goldberg, Kamin \& Garvin represent John Murphy.

This comment pertain to the action item for the McMurray Grading Permit extension. It is our understanding that Mr. Murphy's request for a one-year Grading Permit extension was denied and instead was granted a two-month extension ending on July 8, 2020. We again would ask that the Grading Permit extension be extended for one year.

The current site is in safe and stable condition. Further, the site is not in danger of polluting any of the surrounding area.

The need for a year-long extension is crucial as further earth moving/grading cannot occur until a new silt sock is placed on the site per Allegheny County Conservation District. This has been unable to occur due to COVID-19.

A larger issue also preventing
further work being done is the discovery of a PennDot water outlet on the site. PennDot placed this water outlet on the site without an easement or permission. This issue can only be resolved by a joint permit from PennDot which cannot happen by July 8 .

Due to these issues, which are out of the control of our client, grading cannot continue at this time and cannot be completed by July 8. Due to these issues, the original one-year extension in completely reasonable. We respectfully request that a one-year Grading Permit extension be granted."

He would like -- goes on to clarify, "The Joint Permit is actually from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. A permit from PennDOT is however also likely to be required. However, the fact remains that earth moving/grading cannot resume until those permits are obtained, and that cannot happen by July 8, 2020. Thank you, JJ Bolock."
