PRESIDENT MOURY: Okay. I'd like to call to
order the Regular Council Meeting of August 10, 2020.
Mr. Christian, would you please call the roll.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Dr. Campbell?
DR. CAMPBELL: Here.

At this time, could we stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.
(Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.)

PRESIDENT MOURY: Okay. At this time, I would like to go to Chair Announcements.

An executive session of Council was conducted on August 10, 2020, tonight, before we came to the floor for personnel and legal issues.

At this time, I would like to turn the Reports of the Officials; and the Library Director's Report.

MS. MCINTOSH: Good evening. My name is Christine. I'm the Director of your public library, where we provide opportunities to explore, learn, create, and connect.

August is usually a downtime for us, but we do have a few programs going on. We have Introduction to Scratch Programming, which will be virtual through the Zoom platform. So it will take place on August 13th and 14th at 2:00 p.m. This two-part class will teach kids computer coding skills using the Scratch Program
platform. This is for grades four through six.
We also have team breakout games, which will be virtual, on Monday, August 24 th at 7:00 p.m., where you will have 45 minutes to work together to figure out the clues, solve the mystery, and break into the prize box.

We ask that you register. And tell your friends because you'll do it as a group. This is for grades seven and up. So whenever you -- you can either call and register or you can register online. But when you do so for a virtual program, we ask for your email. And you'll receive a Zoom invitation in your email.

We are doing Storytime in the Park in
person. Last week was our first week doing it this year. So we ask that you come and read and play with us while we explore and discover some of the community's finest parks. Don't forget to bring a blanket and sunscreen.

This program is for two- to six-year-olds with their caregiver. No registration is necessary. Just come. We ask that you do wear a mask and practice social distancing. It's on Tuesdays in August at 9:30. So on August 11th, our staff will be at Elm Park, and on August 18 th at Miner's Park.

And summer reading programs for adults continue through the end of August, through the 31 st. So you can submit an entry for the weekly $\$ 25$ gift card raffle with each book read or listened to. All entries submitted by the 31 st of August will be entered into our grand prize drawing, which this year is a dash cam.

We have a few fundraisers coming up. A big one, a golf outing, on Monday, September 21 st at Nemacolin Country Club. It's $\$ 200$ per golfer. If you want to join us for dinner only, that's $\$ 75$.

The day begins with brunch at 10:00 a.m., with a shotgun start at 12 noon. And proceeds benefit the Bethel Park Fantastic Four Charities, which are the Community Foundation, the Education Foundation, the Historical Society, and the library.

And September is Love Your Library Month. So we ask that you show your library some love by donating during that month. Your donation will be matched on a prorated basis by the Jack Buncher Foundation. This year's match pool is $\$ 200,000$ for all of the libraries in Allegheny County.

Watch for commercials detailing all that the library provides to you free of service -- I mean free of charge -- services free of charge to residents of

Bethel Park and all of Allegheny County. These commercials will be on BPTV, on YouTube, and on our Facebook page.

The library will not be hosting its annual book sale in September due to Covid-19 restrictions. And we are not accepting donations of books, DVDs or used material at this time.

And given that most classes, programs, and events will remain virtual through the Zoom platform through the end of the year, the library's operating hours will remain limited. So we're open Monday through Thursday, 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.; Friday and Saturday, 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. We will have no Sunday hours for the remainder of the year.

And we are currently one of only eleven out of the 70 library locations in Allegheny County that are open for in-person services.

So, that is all I have.
PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much.
Can we turn to the Police Chief's Report; and Chief O'Connor.

If you didn't hear me earlier, that was my fault. I didn't have my microphone on. I think Mr. O'Brien turned it off.

MR. O'BRIEN: Don't let in happen again. CHIEF O'CONNOR: Good evening everybody. Chief here.

And, again, this month, we had to cancel the National Night Out. We also have no Crime Watch meetings scheduled. I don't know when they'll resume, when it's safe to resume. We will pick back up, but not until it's safe to resume.

What I do want you to know is, though, we have some very dedicated team of officers out there every day serving the community. In addition to this pandemic, we are in an opioid epidemic. We had a rash of overdoses the end of July. Our officers, in two cases, administered Narcan and saved two individuals.

Our arrests are up. And not everybody is going quietly into the night. I don't know if the COVID-19 is making people agitated. It could be. But we don't get to social distance when we're putting Narcan up someone's nose or rolling around on the ground getting them into handcuffs. But our people will be out there doing their job for the community every day.

And, again, a very dedicated staff of officers, dispatchers. And the dispatchers are working really hard now with the $C-19$. They have to screen
every medical call and let the first responders know if the person's positive or not. And our admin staff will step out of their traditional roles and help out, too.

So I just wanted to report that we're fully functioning. We'll get through this. It's a little difficult, but we'll get through it. So $I$ just want to tell everybody, we're there for you. And God bless America. Questions? PRESIDENT MOURY: Any discussion from

It's good to see everybody in person again. I hope everybody is having a wonderful and safe summer. With that, we'll get into the Fire Chief's Report.

First thing's first, we do have a
fundraising announcement for this Sunday, August l6th from 12:00 to 5:00 behind the Brightwood Station on Park Avenue. We're actually having a Yovi's food and Kona

Ice truck. So please come out. We do get a portion of the proceeds that will be generated.

The community is so great to us. And we're very gracious to have a wonderful and supporting community when it comes to our fundraising. So we hope everyone can make it and get some food. If you need more details, there's a menu on our Facebook page at Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company at Facebook.

So with that, here's the Incident Report for
July 2020: We had two structure fires, three brush fires, three gas leaks, two vehicle accidents, one unstable load, two odor investigations, one assist EMS, nine good intent calls, 20 fire alarms, and five co alarms, for a total of 48 incidents.

One thing $I$ will say with it being so dry, please use caution when you're having a recreation fire. We've had a couple incidents this past weekend where, you know, fire was spread easy in these dry conditions. So please be safe out there.

And good evening. I just had a couple announcements this evening. Two weeks -- I think it was two weeks ago, I sent out a SwiftReach message, saying that Community Day was cancelled this year. So if anyone didn't get that message, $I$ just want to let you know that it is cancelled.

Council looked at it long and hard, and, you know, based on the situation, they did opinion polls and so on. Most people didn't want to have it, and they were not comfortable being there. So it will be back next year bigger than ever.

But on a happy note, our Community Center will reopen on August 22. But there will be limited hours. And, actually, the hours are pretty good. Monday through Friday, they'll be open 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.; Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.; and Sunday, 12 noon to 6:00 p.m.

DR. CAMPBELL: I had several people contact me within the last several weeks about, you know, basically, kudos and great praise for the new Internet website that we have, Bethelpark. net.

And we've done quite a bit of work in Council in hiring and establishing the infrastructure to kind of build up the -- our IT section as much as possible. And we have a new look on our website. It's easier to navigate. It has a variety of email subscriptions that residents can sign up for.

And, particularly, there's nine I'd like to highlight just to let our citizens know. Bethel Park event cancelations and closures are on the website now. Bethel Park recreational informational program, including news events, breaking news like water main breaks, road closures, snow closings, other emergencies.

There's a lot of community service and assistance events. With COVID-19, there's been a lot of food drives, a lot of collection events that have taken place. You could subscribe there.

The coronavirus information, we've put on quite a bit of data just to try and inform our citizens of, you know, nuts and bolts, things about the virus prevention, as well as how it's affected the government, and their government.

The farmers market, the Mayor talked about that today. You could look there and see specials, the vendors who are there, the timing of the events. Field notifications and closures, whether they're having work done on them or weather events.

You could also find new Municipal, Council, Commission, and Board events all posted on there as well. And, importantly, also, utility traffic closures, road closures, events will be posted on that as well.

We have a newer vigor that's been established, also, with our media, our online content. We're still keeping the chronicles. We're still keeping the swift water reach -- outreach. We think that's very important. If necessary, we're still going to be able to public on hard copy on the Municipal walls, on the buildings, on the doors and all for other events.

But we've also adopted a new agenda, meeting and software management. It's called Unicode. And it's pretty impressive. You notice we have service pros.

We're no longer killing rainforests -- entire rainforests every time we have a meeting.

You want me to take the mask down so you can hear me a little better.

But, you know, we're going paperless. And we're really updating and modernizing. This has spilled over even to our police department with some of the department -- with some of the innovations and developments that we put into play there to bring their system up to speed.

Everything like our munici- -- our Municipal mission statement, our -- the Manager's initiatives, the values that we have, Blueprint Bethel Park, our ten-year plan, that will all be on there as well. And it's accessible. And you can, you know, take a good look at that.

And hopefully, this will engage and nurture a lot better civic involvement, you know, for the citizens of Bethel Park. And, really, and part of the reason $I$ wanted to mention this, $I$ want to -- $I$ want to give some kudos out to some folks.

Karen Colussi, Dave Cable, they've done incredible jobs with the web site, the communications, email modules, the subscriptions.

Kelly Gastgeb with her social media training, the advancement and marketing that she's done not only for the directors, but also, you know, for us as well.

Kim Weightman, you know, for the press and news releases, the training of the directors, better communicate both verbal and written with the residents.

And, of course, the division leadership of Laurence Christian, our Municipal Manager.

So that's all $I$ got to say about that, Mr. President. Thank you.

Council has discussed on this matter and does not pose a hive mentality. We must beware and be careful to construct regulations to protect the homeowners that reside beside the bee hive. By no means is this a honey of a deal. Or do we expect a swarm of applications?

Currently, we do not wish anyone to feel the sting of our new ordinance. And after tonight, this will truly be behind us. As Mr. Moury said so kindly, and he asked me tonight to behave.

So in the words of my mentor and friend, the Honorable Ralph Adam Holzer (phonetic), be brief, be bright and be done.

And it will be the first time, if you want to put a hive in, you need to come in and get a fee. And then each year following, you will need to notify us whether or not you're going to continue with the bee hive. Because if you don't, there may be other insects that would take IT over, and you're required to take it down.

So there is a small fee initially. But then year two and forward, you will have to notify us. And if you're not going to use it for bees, beware, you're going to have to take it done.

MR. O'BRIEN: I don't remember the year, but I'm going to say somewhere in the '90s, this was -- the Challenge Grant Program was started by a group of Councilmen, led by me. And it turned out to be one of the most successful interactions between our Recreation and Municipal to generate money to make them feel like
they're part of the process, part of their facilities. It applies to any -- any and all recreation. We've had very creative grants over the years.

So I'm not really sure where Mr. Harrison's coming with this. I think it's great. Thank you.

I'll just comment, also, to follow up, and Mr. O'Brien. The money -- there's a $\$ 25,000$ limit set by the Recreation Board. And it's matched, really, dollar for dollar. The match from the Municipal side is money that's generated from the Banner Program, which includes the banners that they sell at Park Avenue, Millennium, and some of the other municipal fields. So it's technically not taxpayer money. It's coming from money generated from the Banner Fund. So that's where it came from.

I'd like to thank the Recreation Board, the groups, and our Municipal staff for reviving this, per Mr. O'Brien's conversation, and, really, given the group a sense of ownership and a commitment.

So for this $\$ 5,000$, we're getting $\$ 10,000$ worth of work. So it's a good investment, which is being paid for out of the Banner Fund.
