MR. MOURY: Okay. I'd like to call
to order the Regular Council Meeting of
February 11, 2019.

Chief O'Connor, can you please call the
roll.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Affirmative.
Campbell.

DR. CAMPBELL: Present.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Consolmagno.

MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Dixon.

(No response was heard.)

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Gibbons.

MS. GIBBONS: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Hannan.

MR. HANNAN: Present.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Harrison.

MR. HARRISON: Present.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: McLean.

MR. McLEAN: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Moury.

MR. MOURY: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: O'Brien.

1 MR. O'BRIEN: Present.

2 MR. MOURY: We have eight members
3 present.

4 At this time can we stand for the Pledge
5 of Allegiance.

6 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance was
7 recited.)

8 MR. MOURY: Okay. Before we get
9 into the agenda for the residents who are
10 attending the meeting tonight, under Item C --
11 Item G, appointing of a Zoning Hearing Board
12 alternate, that item has been removed from the
13 agenda.

14 Okay. I would like to turn to Chair
15 Announcements.

16 An executive session of council was
17 conducted on January 28, 2019, to discuss
18 personnel items and legal issues, and tonight
19 before we came out, February 11, 2019,
20 personnel items and legal issues.

21 At this time I would like to turn to the
22 Reports of Officials, and the library
23 director's report.

24 MS. McINTOSH: Thank you.

25 Good evening. My name is Christine. I

1 am the director of your public library where
2 we provide opportunities to explore, learn,
3 create and connect. I have a few classes and
4 services to talk about this evening.

5 The first is an APP Playground For
6 Parents, which will be held on Thursday,
7 February 21st, at 7:00 p.m.

8 All parents worry about screen time with
9 their children. If you're looking for some
10 guidelines on quality apps for your kids, this
11 class is for you. Come and try out a few of
12 our favorite age and educationally appropriate
13 apps before you download. Your children are
14 welcome. We want them to play, too. We do
15 ask that you register so we have enough
16 devices.

17 Tuesdays in February we have Adapted
18 Storytime. This is 9:30 in the morning. So
19 this class engages participants through story,
20 music, and movement, and offers educational
21 and social opportunities for children with
22 differing abilities, their siblings, parents,
23 caregivers, and their typically developing
24 peers.

25 The storytime will take place in a safe,

1 non-judgmental environment with interactive
2 book-based experiences. There is limited
3 registration so there's not an overwhelming
4 number of children or a lot of noise. This
5 storytime is for Ages 2 to 6 with a caregiver.

6 Beginning Tuesday, February 19th, and
7 continuing through April 9th, the library will
8 be hosting an AARP Tax-Aide, which is free tax
9 assistance for taxpayers with low or middle
10 income, with special attention to those who
11 are age 60 or older.

12 The AARP Tax-Aide volunteers will be
13 available every Tuesday at the library from
14 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. Registration is
15 first come, first served. We do not take
16 appointments. We do ask that you bring last
17 year's tax return and any pertinent documents
18 for this year's tax return.

19 And I want to make sure everybody knows
20 that the municipal building doors do not open
21 until 8:00 a.m. So if you come, you're going
22 to be stuck outside.

23 While we're talking about taxes, Tax
24 Forms. The PA Department of Revenue has
25 discontinued the practice of sending bulk

1 forms to the library and to the post office,
2 for that matter, in a -- in an effort to meet
3 their strategic goal of providing more
4 electronic filing options for taxpayers. So
5 the library does not have any state tax forms.

6 The library does, however, have the new
7 federal Form 1040. There's no longer a 1040EZ
8 or a 1040A. All taxpayers will use the
9 redesigned Form 1040. And many people will
10 only need to file the 1040 and no schedules,
11 like a half a page. But if you have any
12 deductions or credits, you'll have to complete
13 some of the Form 1040 schedules. The library
14 does not have copies of any of these
15 schedules. The IRS is not printing them in
16 bulk.

17 So forms for PA tax or IRS schedules can
18 be downloaded from the respective websites.
19 You can also call the respective departments
20 and request that forms be e-mailed, faxed or
21 mailed to you.

22 And just one announcement. The library
23 will be closed on Monday, February 18th, for
24 staff development day. Just a remainder that
25 late fees are not charged on days that the

1 library is closed. And that is all.

2 MR. MOURY: Any questions?

3 (No response was heard.)

4 MR. MOURY: You're safe for one
5 extra day, O'Brien.

6 MR. O'BRIEN: I'm safe.

7 MR. MOURY: Thank you very much.

8 Can we turn to the Police Chief's report,
9 and Chief O'Connor.

10 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Good evening, Mr.
11 Mayor, Council. Hi, everybody. Chief here
12 with my report.

13 I want to thank Dr. D from Tri-Community
14 who appeared at our last crime watch meeting.
15 It was very well attended and very
16 informative. So I want to thank him and
17 Tri-Community.

18 The next crime watch will be Monday, the
19 4th of March, at 7:00 p.m. at the Community
20 Center, and we'll work on getting another
21 speaker.

22 I do have one -- one personal appeal to
23 everybody out there. Please, in the overnight
24 hours, do not leave your cars unlocked. Do
25 not leave your cars unlocked with valuables in

1 your cars. Do not leave your cars unlocked
2 with valuables and firearms in your cars. We
3 have someone out there that's prowling around
4 and we have several items missing from several
5 cars over the past week.

6 So if we take items out of the cars and
7 lock our cars up, there would be no thievery
8 out there. So I'm going to thank everybody in
9 advance for their cooperation.

10 Any questions?

11 MR. MOURY: Any questions?

12 (No response was heard.)

13 MR. MOURY: Hearing none; thank you
14 very much, Chief.

15 Can we turn to the Fire Chief's report.

16 ASSISTANT CHIEF BEESON: All right.
17 I'm here on behalf of Dave Gerber, our Fire
18 Chief. I'm Assistant Fire Chief, Russ Beeson.

19 The total run calls for the month of
20 January, the volunteer fire company was very
21 busy in January with a total of 52 calls;
22 three structure fires, one chimney fire, one
23 vehicle fire, one outside fire, one -- no,
24 five gas leaks, two electrical conditions, two
25 carbon monoxide incidents, one vehicle

1 accident cleanup, thirteen good intent calls,
2 twenty fire alarms, and three alarms.

3 And we would like to, also, put our
4 message out to the community as well. Home
5 fires are more often to occur in the winter
6 than any other season. As you stay cozy and
7 warm this winter season, be fire smart.

8 Half of all home heating fires occur in
9 the months of December, January, and February.
10 With that said, keep anything that can burn at
11 least three feet away from a heat source like
12 your fireplace, your wood stoves, or those
13 space heaters. Plug only one space heater in
14 per outlet in your home.

15 If you're burning in your fireplace and
16 you remove your ashes, store your ashes in a
17 tight covered metal container and keep it at
18 least 10 feet away from your home or any other
19 nearby buildings.

20 With that, that's the Fire Chief's
21 report. Any questions or comments?

22 MR. MOURY: Any questions?

23 (No response was heard.)

24 MR. MOURY: Hearing none; thank you
25 very much.

1 MR. O'BRIEN: Thank you very much.

2 MR. MOURY: Can we turn -- I
3 apologize for not adding this at the
4 beginning -- we have the EMS Director's
5 report. You are now on.

6 MS. HELFRICH: I am now on. Thank
7 you. Are you sure I'm now on?

8 Good evening. I'm the EMS Director for
9 Tri-Community South. I've been asked to come
10 to bring up our subscription drive. The
11 second mailing -- hi. He came to visit me --
12 started, will be mailed this week, and we're
13 hoping people will support their EMS service.
14 We don't receive any tax dollars from any of
15 the three communities that own and operate us
16 and we're nonprofit.

17 Currently we only have 5,422 residents
18 out of 28,000 households that support
19 Tri-Community at this time. So that's where
20 we generate the revenue to operate so your tax
21 dollars are not used for us. So we hope you
22 support us. Thank you.

23 MR. MOURY: Thank you very much.

24 We'll turn to the Mayor's Report, and
25 Mayor Allen.

1 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you. And I
2 will say firsthand I know it's better to
3 subscribe to the EMS than try to use them if
4 you don't have a subscription. It costs a lot
5 more.

6 MS. HELFRICH: Yes, it does.

7 I forgot. We run over 7,200 calls a year
8 and about 600 a month.

9 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay.

10 MS. HELFRICH: So, thanks.

11 MAYOR ALLEN: All right. I
12 actually just have a few housekeeping items
13 this evening.

14 The first one I want to talk about is our
15 pole painting. We have, and as you've
16 probably noticed, new signs going up on all
17 the streets in Bethel Park. So we're in the
18 midst now of putting a program together with
19 the public works director to paint the poles.
20 The poles will be painted black.

21 So if you have an organization, Boy
22 Scouts, Girl Scouts, Indian Princess, that can
23 help that, if you contact the municipal
24 building, (412)831-6800, extension 211 is
25 Janet, and she'll be able to take your

1 information and then we'll see what we have
2 available.

3 I want to thank Dr. Campbell because he
4 did a town hall meeting this past week which
5 was very, very -- I mean, he did a great job,
6 and there was a lot of information that we
7 learned from there.

8 And the one thing I wanted to bring up is
9 that we do have a website, www.BethelPark.net,
10 and anything that you want to know about
11 Bethel Park is on that website. You can sign
12 up for Savvy Citizen. You can find out the
13 construction projects that are going on. On
14 88 especially you'll know exactly what's going
15 on down there. Questions about garbage pickup
16 and recycling. And you can get ahold of
17 anyone or phone numbers for any of the
18 municipal offices.

19 Which brought me to the one idea or one
20 thing I wanted to mention, was the Swiftreach
21 program that we have. We don't use it that
22 often, but it's very important when we do. We
23 did it in the case of the flooding last year.
24 We did it about three weeks ago when we were
25 supposed to get a big snowstorm.

1 But if we don't have your number in the
2 system, we can't call you. You can go to our
3 website and you can put the information in.
4 If you have an unlisted number or you have a
5 cell phone, you can be contacted that way.
6 And I do know that my daughter has a cell
7 phone. She was in Disney World when she got
8 contacted about the snowstorm in Pittsburgh.
9 So it didn't affect her, but ...

10 Also, on the bottom of the one page
11 you'll find the Blueprint icon. The
12 municipality is seeking public input for the
13 long range comprehensive plan update,
14 otherwise known as Blueprint Bethel Park.

15 If you have any thoughts or ideas
16 concerning walkability, housing, attracting
17 new businesses, infrastructure like roads and
18 sewers and parks, please attend the second
19 public meeting, and that will be held
20 Thursday, March 14th, at 7 o'clock at the
21 Community Center.

22 In the meantime, if you click on that
23 site, there'll will be a survey there. You
24 can open that and give your input on what you
25 think Bethel Park should look like in the next

1 10 years. So that's our website,
2 BethelPark.net.

3 And, finally, if anybody wants to watch
4 council meetings or anything from BPTV, you
5 can go on YouTube and you can see council
6 meetings from over 10 years ago.

7 MR. MOURY: Is that a good or a bad
8 thing?

9 MAYOR ALLEN: Well, you'll see some
10 people you didn't -- you'll say I remember
11 that person, so... But I just want to thank
12 everyone, just a little housekeeping, and
13 that's my report.

14 MR. HARRISON: Mayor, maybe I can
15 just comment because I've had some interaction
16 with people.

17 A lot of people had their landline phone
18 numbers in this system and they -- and they
19 went to cell phones and they did away with
20 their landlines. So I think those folks ought
21 to just maybe remember that if they did away
22 with their landline, they won't get the call
23 unless they give us the correct number --

24 MAYOR ALLEN: Right.

25 MR. HARRISON: -- to call, and I

1 think that's the point you made.

2 MAYOR ALLEN: Absolutely. A lot of
3 people are doing that.

4 MR. HARRISON: And I think that's
5 why that happened, because a lot of people
6 said, well, I didn't get a call.

7 MAYOR ALLEN: Right.

8 MR. HARRISON: And I said, well, do
9 you still have your landline; no. Well,
10 that's probably the number that we have for
11 you.

12 MAYOR ALLEN: Right. So if you go
13 on to the Bethel Park website and just type in
14 Swiftreach, it will take you to the police
15 station -- or police page and then you can put
16 your number in there or how you want to be
17 contacted.

18 So we really -- I don't even know the
19 percentage of calls that we have versus
20 residents, but I still think there's a long
21 way to go to help everybody.

22 MR. HARRISON: Maybe The Almanac
23 can put a -- we put it in the Chronicle, but
24 maybe the Almanac could put a little article
25 reminding people that they have to have the

1 correct number in the Swiftreach to get the
2 calls for the emergencies or whatever.

3 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Good idea.

4 MR. MOURY: Thank you.

5 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you.

6 MR. MOURY: Thank you, Mayor.

7 And I would just like to comment on
8 Blueprint Bethel Park. It's our long range
9 plan. The new survey I think came out last
10 week. I think last survey we did we had about
11 500 people participate. I would encourage
12 everybody to go to the website and participate
13 and/or attend the public meeting.

14 You know, it's really a community
15 project. We want to see what the community
16 would like to see as a vision for the next 10
17 years in Bethel Park.

18 Okay. At this time I would like to turn
19 to the approval of the Bills and Payrolls.

20 Mr. Hannan.

21 MR. HANNAN: I move that we approve
22 the bills and payrolls for the municipality
23 per a Bill List No. 021119 in the amount of
24 \$2,314,881.22.

25 MS. GIBBONS: Second.

1 MR. MOURY: There's a motion by Mr.
2 Hannan and a second by Ms. Gibbons that we
3 approve the bills and payrolls for the
4 municipality per Bill List No. 021119 in the
5 amount of \$2,314,881.22.

6 Any discussion of this item?

7 (No response was heard.)

8 MR. MOURY: Chief, would you please
9 call the roll.

10 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Campbell.

11 DR. CAMPBELL: Yes.

12 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Consolmagno.

13 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Yes.

14 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Gibbons.

15 MS. GIBBONS: Yes.

16 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Hannan.

17 MR. HANNAN: Yes.

18 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Harrison.

1 MR. MOURY: Motion passes 8/0.

2 At this time I'd like to turn to the
3 Residents' Comments section for non-agenda
4 items.

5 Mr. Pahler, if you'd come up and state
6 your name and address for the record, please.

7 MR. PAHLER: Richard Pahler, 1119
8 Logan Road. I have a few pieces of paper that
9 I got through the borough about my property.
10 I'm just going to go over a couple brief
11 things.

12 One was, you know, a bill from 1996 that
13 the borough paid about \$15,000 to install some
14 things on my property, a catch basin and some
15 piping, which at that time I had a
16 conversation with the engineer and explained
17 to him how the water flows through my property
18 and that really was -- you know, it might make
19 a dent in it, but that's about it.

20 On the same document there's a -- a note
21 here, and I've run across this a few times,
22 it's from Bill Spagnol, the old borough
23 manager, and -- I'll leave the person's name
24 out of it. After you read and review this,
25 please call me. Bob Cygrymus and I don't

1 believe Mr. Pahler has a legitimate concern
2 request for the municipality.

3 So what they're saying is I don't have a
4 lawsuit against you guys. But yet on another
5 document from a meeting I had in 1998 with
6 Bill Spagnol, Bob Cygrymus, Thor DiCesare,
7 and, again, they've left a person's name off
8 of this, it goes through all the issues that I
9 had, some damage that was done when the
10 borough came into my property. And the thing
11 I want to point out is it says -- Mr. Spagnol
12 further stated the municipality would consider
13 a final monetary settlement -- money
14 settlement with Mr. Pahler, who could then
15 make whatever property improvements he wanted.
16 However, Mr. Pahler would have to agree in
17 writing that such sum of money would be a
18 final settlement. In other words, I'd be
19 stuck with the house and I'd be stuck with the
20 problem.

21 They have a note on here with respect to
22 the above items -- now, this is your document.
23 With respect to the above items, Mr. Pahler
24 indicated that he would consider the
25 municipality's offer. That's a flat out lie.

1 I asked for them off of my property.

2 Okay. I think I know why one of the
3 reasons is, that this one person's name was
4 left off of this meeting, left off the other
5 documents, it's the same reason that Thor
6 DiCesare's name, who was the engineer at the
7 borough at the time, he resigned shortly after
8 that. And when I ran into him, he explained
9 that he had a law degree, too, and he wasn't
10 going to lose his law degree over Bethel Park.

11 So that kind of tells you why there was a
12 name left off of here who was at that meeting
13 and why this guy resigned. They offered me a
14 whopping \$5,000 to, in Mr. Spagnol's words, to
15 make me go away. Okay. It's unethical.

16 And then there's a written note on the
17 bottom, Pahler never proposed a monetary
18 settlement amount. They never asked me for
19 one. So I'll come today and ask you for one.
20 Give me \$150,000 and I'll go away and I'll
21 turn over my house to you guys.

22 The same thing with the property. The
23 property -- you know, these are -- there's a
24 note here from Lowry Engineering in 1999 that
25 gave you guys suggestions on how to try to fix

1 the problem. Nothing was ever done. So you
2 paid an engineer, did nothing about it.

3 Further in the documents, let me find it
4 here, conclusions and recommendations. The
5 topographical features and the direct
6 concentrate surface water runoff into and
7 through the property cannot be altered in any
8 significant way that would materially change
9 the volume of both the surface and ground
10 water, which is concentrated and conveyed --
11 and conveyed through the property.

12 So what they're saying -- what your own
13 pro -- you're saying, nothing can fix this
14 problem. But an unwritten rule, you don't
15 want to buy -- you won't buy properties. But
16 that -- that's not true. You do buy
17 properties. You just won't buy my property.
18 Because you -- you have bought other
19 properties.

20 When your own documentation says that it
21 can't be fixed, then I think the taxpayers
22 need to know why. You know, here's 15,000.
23 I'm sure if I dig deeper, you're probably up
24 to about \$100,000. Back in 1996 when I
25 brought this to your attention, you could have

1 bought the house for that. You could have
2 stopped -- or at least slowed down the
3 additional flooding that has happened since --
4 in the last 30 years.

5 There's a lot of things that could have
6 been done but, again, you guys keep spending
7 money, taxpayer money, and it's not fixing
8 anything.

9 You could have easily spent the same
10 amount of money, bought the property, built a
11 detention pond and saved all those homeowners
12 downstream from me.

13 MR. MOURY: I'd ask you conclude
14 your comments, please.

15 MR. PAHLER: Okay. One last thing.
16 Statement of the problem, okay, this is from
17 your -- the property is located -- okay, my
18 property does not receive flooding directly
19 from Logan Creek. The property is located 350
20 feet north of the stream channel. The house
21 on the property's site ground elevation is
22 1,072 feet. The stream channel is an
23 elevation of 1,060 feet. So I'm 12 feet over
24 the creek, okay, which -- and the property
25 digs down, too. So it's even worse.

1 While the property is not directly
2 flooded from the stream overflow to the
3 property, it is adversely impacted during the
4 stream flooding due to the reduced capacity of
5 drainage system. Okay. So, again, it's not
6 -- it's backing up.

7 The property's situated within a natural
8 drainage swale which is a sub-catchment of
9 Logan Creek. The upstream land area, which
10 drains to the property, consists of
11 approximately 22 acres and includes Gatewood
12 Drive, part of Greenbriar Road, and part of
13 Scenic View Drive and Sarah Street. This is
14 where they built all the homes that created
15 this flooding.

16 MR. MOURY: Thank you very much.

17 Any other residents who would like to
18 speak?

19 (No response was heard.)

20 MR. MOURY: Hearing none; can we
21 turn to General Policy and Finance.

22 And, Mr. McLean, we have no residents
23 signed up to speak.

24 MR. McLEAN: Thank you, Mr.
25 President.

1 The first item is resignation of Shawn
2 Arbaugh. I move that we accept Shawn
3 Arbaugh's resignation from Bethel Park
4 municipal manager dated January 14, 2019.

5 MR. HANNAN: Second.

6 MR. MOURY: There's a motion and a
7 second that we accept Shawn Arbaugh's
8 resignation from Bethel Park municipal manager
9 dated January 14, 2019.

10 I guess I'll just quickly comment on
11 this. I'd like to wish Shawn well. He's
12 returning to Sandy Township, the town in which
13 he was born and raised. So we appreciate his
14 efforts in everything he's done. This was a
15 turbulent year, a lot of flooding, a lot going
16 on last year, but we certainly do appreciate
17 all his efforts.

18 Any other discussion?

19 (No response was heard.)

20 MR. MOURY: Hearing none; Chief,
21 would you please call the roll.

22 MR. O'CONNOR: Campbell.

23 DR. CAMPBELL: Yes.

24 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Consolmagno.

25 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Yes.

13 MR. MOURY: Motion passes 8/0.
14 Mr. McLean.
15 MR. McLEAN: The next item is
16 appointment of an interim municipal manager.
17 I move that we appoint Chief Timothy
18 O'Connor as interim municipal manager
19 effective February 11, 2019.
20 MR. HANNAN: Second.
21 MR. MOURY: There's a motion and a
22 second we appoint Chief Timothy O'Connor as
23 interim municipal manager effective February,
24 11, 2019.
25 Any discussion of this item?

1 MR. HARRISON: Mr. Moury.

2 MR. MOURY: Mr. Harrison.

3 MR. HARRISON: I've had many
4 positive comments about Chief O'Connor and the
5 police department during his tenure, and so I
6 appreciate all his efforts. But because of
7 the opiate problem, because of the threats in
8 the school system, and all of the other police
9 activities that he has to address, I just
10 think we're overloading him and, therefore,
11 I'm going to vote no on this motion. Thank
12 you.

13 MR. MOURY: Thank you very much.

14 Any other discussion?

15 (No response was heard.)

16 MR. MOURY: Hearing none; Chief
17 O'Connor, would you please call the roll.

18 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Campbell.

19 DR. CAMPBELL: Yes.

20 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Consolmagno.

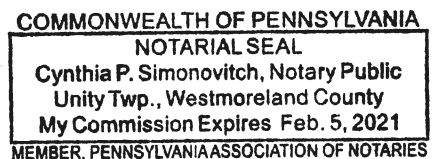
