Also, Winter Reading Club for children birth through high school started this week, and it will continue through the month of January. So we hope you come in and pick up some materials and start reading.

All of our story times are back in session, as are adult programs and clubs.

Please drive carefully when there's snow and icy conditions out.

The one thing you can really do is make sure you have good tires on your car, weigh down the back of your vehicle. Please maintain a safe distance between you and the vehicle in front of you. And go slow. You know, tailor your speed to the conditions, not to the posted speed limit, and we'll all get through this right into the spring, right into St. Patrick's Day.

Right, Mr. Vice President? That has a nice ring to it.

And I'm going to watch the game tonight. Roll Tide.

CHIEF GERBER: Hi there. Happy New Year to everybody. Glad to see everybody. Congratulations all the new Councilmembers and to all the returning Councilmembers.

For the month of December, in 2021, we had four structure fires, one vehicle fire, one gas leak, two electrical conditions, three power lines down, one we assisted a resident who was locked out of their house, one water condition, ten good intent calls, two smoke investigations, ten fire alarms, and three CO alarms, totaling 38 calls for the month of December.

In 2021, the Bethel Park Volunteer

Fire Company ran 538 calls. That's up 65

over last year. Last year, we were down.

Amazingly enough, with COVID and all, we were

down a good 100 calls. So the call volume is going back up, and we're keeping busy and all.

Just one quick thing I would like to ask everybody. Unfortunately, as Chief O'Connor said, it's wintertime. It's starting to snow and stuff again, unfortunately. If you have any kind of snow accumulation and you have a fire hydrant on your property, if it's across from your property that, you know, there's not a house or anything, we ask that you clean out the fire hydrant, a 3-foot radius around the hydrant.

So that if, unfortunately, if we would have to use it, we can get to the hydrant. The guys and ladies from the fire department, we can connect the hydrant. But we ask that you please try and maintain some snow clearing and stuff around the hydrant just so in case we need it so we can get to it.

The last thing you want to do with an emergency is to have us to have to start shoveling before we get water. So a very important item. And we'd appreciate anybody

- who can help us with that to take care of that.

MR. HARRISON: I served 48 years as it is as a 5th Ward Councilman. During that time I commented many times about the slippery slope our precious nation created by our forebears slid slowly toward socialism.

President Moury took the microphone each time to state that Harrison's -- "that's Harrison's opinion and not supported by Council or the staff." He never polled Council to determine if that's a fact. He just stated the case and ruled like a dictator.

A few years ago I read into the record -- several years ago I read into the record a quote by then-Soviet Premier

Khrushchev. He said, "We will take America without firing a shot. We will bury you. We can't expect the American people to jump from capitalism to communism, but can we assist

Year 2020- -- the reason I'm citing this is, year '22 is an election year where all the seats in the House of Representatives and a third of the seats in the Senate are up for election. As I stated, this is an opportunity --

This is an opportunity for the citizens to correct the situation that our nation is in at this time. So my purpose for making these presentations is to encourage people to determine who are the candidates that are running for election that will support our constitutional system is formed by

    our framers, and hopefully that will resolve
    the situation we're going in.

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3 Because I don't -- I don't talk to 4 many people that are very happy with the situation we're in now. And hopefully we can rectify that by electing people who will 6 7 support the constitution form of the government that was -- that was put together 8 by our framers.

So I would appreciate that people would take -- take note of the fact that this is an election year, expend some efforts learning who are the candidates that will push our nation back to a constitutional organization and not socialism, and see if we can reverse this trend.

DR. CAMPBELL: Two settlements were reached for the opioid crisis between the PA state general -- general office -- general attorneys office in Johnson & Johnson this past year, as well as with three pharmaceutical distributors as well.

Pennsylvania was one of 46 states to join with four territories and the District of Columbia in negotiating these settlements.

This motion is necessary for us to -as Bethel Park to opt in on the claims made
by the state. To put this in perspective,
the settlement is currently around 26 billion
dollars. Pennsylvania stands to gain
possibly a billion dollars from the -- from
payments.

And just to kind of drive the lesson kind of home and let us know how personal this is: In Pennsylvania, we had 16,800 people die in Pennsylvania between 2017 and 2020.

The population of Bethel Park is about twice that. So we've lost the equivalent in Pennsylvania in those few years as many as half of our population of Bethel Park alone.

In 2021, we lost 5,172 Pennsylvania residents.

So the opioid crisis is palpable.

It's real. In one way or another it affects all of us. You may not think that it affects you in a lot of different ways. But by insurance premiums, by rates of crime, insurance policies, everything across the board, it will -- healthcare, it affects us to some degree.

So it is my desire and wish that we
