PRESIDENT MOURY: Okay. I'd like to call to order the Regular Council Meeting of December 12, 2022.

Chief O'Connor, would you please call the roll.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Dr. Campbell?

DR. CAMPBELL: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. Cenci?

(No response.)

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. Consolmagno?

MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. Espinar?

(No response.)

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Ms. Flinn?

MS. FLINN: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. Janosik?

MR. JANOSIK: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. Moury?

PRESIDENT MOURY: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. Oakes?

MR. OAKES: Here.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. O'Brien?

1 MR. O'BRIEN: Present.

2 PRESIDENT MOURY: We have eight
3 members present.

4 Prior to --

5 MS. FLINN: Seven.

6 PRESIDENT MOURY: Excuse me. Seven
7 members present. My math is not good tonight.

8 Following the Pledge of Allegiance,
9 I would like everybody to remain standing for
10 a moment of silence for Councilmember Don
11 Harrison, who spent more than 48 years up
12 here, who passed away last week.

13 So at this time, can we stand for the
14 Pledge of Allegiance.

15 - - -

16 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance
17 was recited; and a moment of silence took
18 place.)

19 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you.

20 Okay. At this time, I would like to
21 move to Chair Announcements.

22 Executive session of Council was
23 conducted on November 30, 2022 for personnel
24 matters.

25 And for those that are here this

1 evening, one item that's been removed from the
2 agenda is under the Approval of Minutes,
3 Item B, the Public Hearing Minutes for the
4 Zoning Ordinance Amendment for Short-Term
5 Rentals. That will be on our January agenda.

6 At this time, I would like to turn
7 to the Reports of the Officials; and the
8 Library Director's Report.

9 (No response.)

10 PRESIDENT MOURY: Which I don't
11 believe we have one tonight.

12 I will turn to Chief O'Connor; and
13 the Police Chief's Report.

14 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Mr. Mayor, Council,
15 good evening. Hi, everybody. Chief here.

16 First, I'd like to thank everybody
17 who contributed to our Presents From Police
18 for the kids. We'll be taking these presents
19 out. I think some of them are going to
20 Children's Institute up in Squirrel Hill. So
21 we have many presents.

22 So I really do from the bottom of my
23 heart thank everybody for delivering that.
24 And the police will get them out to the kids.
25 So thank you so much, and God bless you.

1 Our Crime Watch meeting was well
2 attended in December. We're going to take a
3 break because of the holiday in January.
4 We'll not see everybody until February, the
5 first Monday in February, at 7:00 p.m., at the
6 Community Center.

7 I think we're going to do some
8 hands-on training, like defensive tactics.
9 Which I think they're going to handcuff me.
10 I'm the dummy.

11 PRESIDENT MOURY: Better you than me,
12 Chief.

13 MR. O'BRIEN: I'm surprised you
14 didn't ask me to come.

15 CHIEF O'CONNOR: We're always looking
16 for volunteers. You probably have some
17 experience being in handcuffs. But I won't go
18 there.

19 MR. O'BRIEN: I don't want to discuss
20 that.

21 CHIEF O'CONNOR: And I do want to
22 wish everybody, you know, a happy, happy
23 holiday, New Year, Merry Christmas. And let's
24 have a safe and a sober holiday.

25 By my unofficial counts, we've

1 arrested 83 DUIs so far, and you don't want to
2 be 84, 85, 86, 87.

3 So Merry Christmas, everybody, and
4 God bless. Thank you.

5 The last thing I can say is we're
6 not going to have a Manager's Report because
7 I'm the acting Manager. But I say I've done
8 this for five have months before, and you have
9 my word I will do my utmost and my best to
10 serve the citizens of Bethel Park in this
11 position.

12 Thank you. Good night.

13 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you.

14 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Questions? Anybody,
15 questions?

16 (No response.)

17 PRESIDENT MOURY: Hearing none --

18 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Excellent.

19 PRESIDENT MOURY: -- we're going to
20 turn to the Mayor's Report.

21 That's going to be a tough report to
22 top.

23 MAYOR ALLEN: I only have one job.

24 Thank you, Mr. President, Chief,
25 Council.

1 I have a short report this evening.
2 But first I wanted to bring up our County
3 Councilperson, Tom Duerr. We have a
4 presentation this evening for the Lions Club.
5 They're celebrating their 80th birthday.

6 And if you could come up, and
7 Mr. Duerr will present a Proclamation. Ours
8 will get there before our Christmas cards will
9 though. You will get it.

10 MR. DUERR: Hello. So for those of
11 you who don't know me, I -- for those of you
12 who --

13 No, face that way.

14 For those of you who don't know me,
15 my name's Tom Duerr. I'm the County
16 Councilmember for County Council District 5,
17 which includes Bethel Park.

18 I've been a Bethel Park resident my
19 entire life. I grew up here. I'm a proud
20 product of Bethel Park public school system.
21 And I was honored when someone reached out to
22 -- Danielle reached out to my office to make
23 sure that I honored the Lions Club 80th
24 Anniversary.

25 You know, growing up in Bethel Park,

1 the Lions Club and all of our other
2 institutions here were a big part of what
3 made growing up here so special. And all the
4 work you guys do with all of the various
5 donations and things you guys are involved in
6 are a large part of why I've chosen to stay
7 here and hopefully one day raise a family
8 here.

9 So from everyone at Allegheny County
10 government and from myself of growing up here,
11 all the work you guys do, thank you very, very
12 much. And here's to another 80 years.

13 MS. MEIDENBAUER: Thank you.

14 MR. DUERR: So I will read the
15 Proclamation and then pass it off. And I just
16 want to thank you guys again for all the work
17 that you do to make our community a special
18 place.

19 MS. MEIDENBAUER: Thank you.

20 MR. DUERR: So, whereas, Lions Club
21 International is the largest non-political
22 service club to empower volunteers and
23 partners to improve health and well-being,
24 strengthen communities, support those in need
25 through humanitarian services and grants that

1 impacts lives globally, and encourage peace
2 and international understanding.

3 There are 50,000 Lions Clubs with a
4 membership of 1 point million individuals in
5 over 200 countries; and

6 Whereas, while the first
7 international Lions Club was founded by Melvin
8 Jones in Chicago in 1917, the Bethel Park
9 Lions Club was organized on December 9, 1942,
10 and the charter was presented on February 9,
11 1943, allowing them to celebrate their 80th
12 Anniversary this year, and

13 Whereas, Bethel Park Lions Club is
14 made up of residents, community leaders,
15 business owners and other professionals. They
16 operate as a non-profit that conducts
17 fundraisers and receives donations. This
18 money is then placed back into the community
19 and provided to other organizations in Western
20 Pennsylvania and across the world; and

21 Whereas, Bethel Park Lions Club has
22 a simple goal for its members, service to the
23 community and the support of community needs,
24 which is indicative of the Lions Club mantra,
25 "Lions serve."

1 Meetings give members the opportunity
2 to form friendships, socialize, strategize and
3 hear interesting presentations by inviting
4 guest speakers. Activities and fundraising
5 activities gives the opportunity to serve;
6 and

7 Whereas, over the years, Bethel Park
8 Lions Club has provided support to the Lions
9 Recycle for Sight program by donating unusable
10 -- by donating usable eyewear. Each year,
11 Lions-sponsored collection boxes are placed
12 throughout the community, where they are
13 collected, cleaned, and sorted by prescription
14 strength. Most of the recycled eyeglasses are
15 distributed to people in need in developing
16 countries; and

17 Whereas, also with the funds that
18 are raised, Bethel Park Lions Club has
19 supported and contributed to many
20 organizations like the Bethel Park Historical
21 Society, the Bethel Park High School Boosters,
22 Blind Students Tuition, Center for Hearing and
23 Deaf Services, Tri-County -- Tri-County South
24 Emergency Medical Services EMS, Western
25 Pennsylvania School -- Western Pennsylvania

1 School for the Blind Children, and Western
2 Pennsylvania School for the Deaf.

3 Now, therefore, be it resolved that
4 I, County Council Member, Tom Duerr, do hereby
5 recognize the Bethel Park Lions Club -- Bethel
6 Park Lions Club on their -- on the occasion of
7 its 80th Anniversary and commend them for
8 their efforts in bettering their home
9 community and serving others. I wish them
10 many more -- many more years of success to
11 come.

12 In witness whereof, I have hereunto
13 caused the Seal of the County of Allegheny to
14 be affixed this 12th day of December 2022.

15 And I will say one of the things I
16 have tried to do as a County Councilmember is
17 to make sure when I do give Proclamations, I
18 give them with a special leather binder.

19 So I hope you guys appreciate the
20 Proclamation from the County. And thank you
21 all so much for your service.

22 MS. MEIDENBAUER: Thank you very
23 much. Appreciate it.

24 (Applause.)

25 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Now we need a

1 spokesman to let us know a little about what
2 you're working on, what you've done in the
3 near past.

4 MS. WASKO: I'm not one for speeches.

5 I want to first of all thank Council
6 -- I want to thank Council very much for the
7 donation of the used playground equipment.
8 That is a wonderful, wonderful thing you've
9 done for us. And it is so helpful to us
10 because the other one was really bad.

11 But, as you said, we are primarily
12 raising funds for other groups, primarily for
13 the blind. But we do go into diabetes and
14 other areas. But right now that is our
15 primary focus.

16 We have several fundraisers coming up
17 in the future; fish fries, book sales.

18 What else? Anything else?

19 And, if you don't mind, I'd like to
20 introduce who's with us.

21 MAYOR ALLEN: Absolutely.

22 MS. MEIDENBAUER: Okay. This is
23 Nancy Pflueger. She's third our
24 vice-president.

25 Her husband, Bob, who is the past

1 president, and current chairman of the
2 membership committee.

3 And Ward Burgess, who is our first
4 vice-president.

5 But, again, I really -- I can't thank
6 you people enough for everything you've done
7 for us. You really have been such a help.
8 Thank you.

9 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you.

10 (Applause.)

11 MAYOR ALLEN: The only -- really,
12 the only thing I had this evening was to
13 recognize some of the groups that help the
14 different projects that we have here, like the
15 people that do the trolley beautification.
16 You know, they've been doing that for many,
17 many years, and it continues to get better.

18 If anyone goes past Brightwood and
19 Munroe, they have their little area there
20 decorated for Christmas. They do take pride
21 in what they do.

22 The people that work at our 90-Plus
23 club, the cleanup days, both spring and fall,
24 the turnout that we get for that, and then,
25 of course, the Light-Up Night -- yeah, the

1 Light-up Night that we had at the Community
2 Center, which was probably the biggest one
3 that I could remember.

4 And then we also have our holiday
5 decorating; Halloween and Christmas. I just
6 want to thank the people. It gets larger
7 every year. People are starting to donate --
8 or to call in and recommending homes that
9 should be given an award. So we have a lot to
10 look at.

11 So I just want to thank all the
12 people that helped in 2022; and we look
13 forward to 2023.

14 And on the holiday lighting contest,
15 we still need judges. We still need your
16 input on what houses you feel deserve to win.
17 And if you have one, you can call Janet Davin
18 at 412-831-6800, Extension 211.

19 So we appreciate everything that our
20 volunteers. And not just the local program
21 that we have from the Municipal Building, but
22 we just can't -- we just don't have enough
23 time to name them all from the rec -- all the
24 people in the rec department, all the coaches.
25 It just goes on and on.

1 So, having said that, I want to wish
2 everyone a Merry Christmas and a happy holiday
3 season.

4 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very

25 that works on vacant properties. And we're

1 working that into an eventual Redevelopment
2 Authority, which is -- we already adopted some
3 resolutions to.

4 But we're trying to clear up our
5 books. In the public sector, you can't --
6 you're never going to claim money on that.
7 We've been billing it for taxes, which we're
8 never going to get. You can't write it off
9 like you can the private sector.

10 So we're trying to look at those
11 properties over the last few years. We've
12 added several of them to Municipal properties;
13 some adjacent to Miner's Park, some to Simmons
14 Park.

15 So we're in the -- as we're in the
16 process of cleaning up our books, we found a
17 parcel that was not officially dedicated back
18 in -- probably in the '50s when the road was
19 originally put in.

20 So this is righting a wrong, and
21 we're just trying to clean up our books. So
22 we're not paving a new road. We're not adding
23 to the road. We're just making the road that
24 we paved our own road, if that makes sense.
25 Okay.

1 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Thank you for that
2 clarification, Mr. Moury.

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
