PRESIDENT MOURY: I'd like to call
to order the Public Hearing.
One minute for me to pull up my agenda.

Public Hearing Chapter 27 for
Dangerous Buildings and Structures.
Mr. Christian, would you please call the role.

PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you, everybody.

This is a Pubic Hearing Chapter 27 Dangerous Building Structures. And the way this will go, just so everybody understands, our planner will go over, Mr. Jeff $W$ inkle, the Ordinance, and essentially what we're taking public commentson.

We will then have an opportunity for the public to give - proponents, people infavor, opponents, people against, following his presentation, and also an opportunity for council to speak.

So at this time, $\quad$ would like to turn to Mr. Winkle. If you could give an overview, please, front and center stage.

MR. WINKIE: Thank You, Mr. Moury.
Yes, this evening I'd just like to - I'm happy to present to you the ordinance change of the total rewrite of Chapter 27 Dangerous Buildings and Structures. We'd like to adopt a new Chapter 27 property

Maintenance Code, adoption of the 2015
International Property Maintenance Code with amendments.

I don't know if you want to share the screen, Laurence?

PRESIDENT MOURY: If I could ask everybody online, if you could please mute because we're getting some background, I would appreciate it. Thank you.

MR. CHRISTIAN: It was open. Now it's no longer open.

MR. WINKLE: If you can go to the I drive --

MR. CHRISTIAN: Yeah.
MR. WINKLE: - under Planning.
MR. CHRISTIAN: Yeah. I'm not -my drives aren't on here, Jeff, so...

MR. WINKLE: Okay. All right.
MR. CHRISTIAN: I got them in the -- (indiscernible) codes. If you want to keep talking, it will take me two minutes. MR. WINKLE: Well, as I mentioned, Chapter 27 currently is Dangerous Buildings and Structures. And we would be replacing that with a new Chapter 27 , the Property

Maintenance Code.
If everybody remembers, the
recently adopted - well, recently is short terms - the Comprehensive Plan for Blueprint for Bethel Parkin 2020 . One of the key features there was, it identified strategies to proactively address blighted properties, promote quality neighborhoods.

Housing is an important key in strategies for the - - you know, a benefit of Bethel Park. So it was noted that, you know, we need to not only build, you know, nice developments, but then we need to work to maintain them to keep them upgraded.

The 2020 Property Maintenance Code, which would be the International property Code by the International code's Council, very similar. It's one of the additionsof the International code Council, which we follow through the UCC, which, you know, says to follow the code books that are already drafted, and then you adopt them as a reference and use them. They've been vetted out and, you know, they work for, you know, municipalities ingeneral.

One of the key things we did also, though, was we did keep some of the key provisions that work for Bethel Park. So you don't want to lose your individuality when you're adopting these Uniform Construction Codes or Uniform Maintenance Codes.

One of the key things is that we did keep the section on weeds. It has worked for our Code Enforcement in the past. Junk vehicles, garbage, and there's a couple articles of storm drainage that are touched on within this Property Maintenance Code. But we kept what was important and what worked for Bethel Park.

And, you know, so, basically, on that, you know, those are the key features on it. If you have any questions after the Public Hearing, if there's no opposition or no outstanding questions, we would ask that Council just authorize staff to advertise properly the Ordinance for adoption.

Just make a note that this Public Hearing was properly advertised also. And the Ordinance amendment has been reviewed by
the Planning Commission, and was recommended back in December of 2020 . And it also was reviewed - worked through the solicitor with it on it also, and staff.

So, any questions? I'd love to
answer them from here.
PRESIDENT MOURY: Okay. Does

As Mr. Winkle said, this is just a review as part of Blueprint Bethel Park that he identified we need to go through. And this is a long, arduous process that we've started. We've picked the top key elements or sections of the code that we want to review. And the Planning Commission and staff have been working on it.

So this is going to be a trend over
the next probably few years until we get through the whole code book and make sure everything's up to date and it meets the current standards, and it also helps us protect the neighborhoods - the integrity of the neighborhoods. It gives us, you know, a little more enforcement power and a little guidance to the community on kind of our expectations.
