This is a Public Hearing on the proposed zoning ordinance amendment for signs and billboards.

It's a very similar process.

Ms. Primm will just give an overview of what this -- we have in front of us. We will then ask if there's any public comment, proponents; people in favor, or opponents; people that would be opposed to this Ordinance.

At this time, I would like to turn our Municipal Planner, Ms. Primm.

MS. PRIMM: Before Council is a proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment to Chapter 69 of the Bethel Park Municipal Code to amend provisions and regulations on signs in all zoning districts within the Municipality of Bethel Park.

As per the requirements of the Bethel Park Municipal Code, Chapter 69 Zoning,
Article XXI, Section 69.68 Zoning Amendment
Procedure; the purpose of this Public Hearing is to accept public comment regarding a proposed ordinance amendment.

Council is required to hold a Public Hearing pursuant to public notice as required by the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code Act 247 as amended.

Planning Commission recommended approval at their meeting on May 11, 2022, and re-recommended at their July 13, 2022 meeting, as noted in the Memorandum to Council from me, the Municipal Planner, dated August 17, 2022.

The Public Hearing has been properly advertised, and the proof of publication has been entered into the record on the Bethel Park Exhibit List.

The proposed ordinance amendment has been sent to the County Planning Agency for review and recommendations.

So I do have a brief presentation.

I'm not going to read it word for word, but I am going to just kind of go through each slide briefly, you know, that it could help anyone that does have any guestions.

So, you know, part of this amendment is the Existing Sign and Billboard

Regulations, Definitions, Sign Regulations, a

Conditional Use Application article,

Nonconforming Signs, Appendices, and Next

Steps.

Next slide.

First up, the Existing Sign and Billboard Regulations. So the existing language timeline, the original Zoning Ordinance was updated in about 1966. And as you can see, several amendments have been made to the sign article; 1992, 1998, 1999, and 2007.

Obviously, things have changed since 2007, so it was time to add and update some regulations.

Next slide.

So, the Definitions. We did update several definitions, including, you know, directional informational signs, free-standing signs, incidental, incidental window.

We deleted several definitions such as the flood lighted off premises just because they were repetitive. We did provide more updated definitions.

Next slide.

We did add a number of new definitions, including numerous sign types such as A-frame signs, the military banners, military yard banners that we offer here in Bethel Park, monuments, political signs, temporary signs, and then also sign area, sign face, sign height, and sign supporting structure or base.

Because when it comes to measuring the sign area, which is required for applications, it's just going to make that process a little easier because all of those

will be spelled out.

Regulations. We did update the prohibited signs. You know, obviously, you can get a variance through the Zoning Hearing Board. But this is, you know, the standard of, you know, what we're going to be prohibiting, including roof signs, signs containing mirrors that could be a safety hazard, signs that prevent free access or escape, pendant strings and streamers, you know, portable signs that are not compliant with the rest of our zoning ordinance, et cetera.

We also updated the exempt signs.

These include traffic control devices and

PennDOT signs, signs that post a danger

warning, any signs or emblems of a religious,

civil, philanthropic, historic or educational

organization, you know, free speech, garage

and yard sale signs, holiday and seasonal

decorations, the military banners that we

offer, incidental signs, incidental window

signs.

And what exempt means in that, these types of signs are not required to get a

1 permit.

2.3

So, obviously, those signs do not required permits. But the permit requirements, you know, we're going to require the permits prior to the display, the replacement or modification of any sign being posted.

The Zoning Officer will review, approve, deny all of that. Our sign permit that we currently have will be updated to match our new regulations once this is approved, if it is approved. So that will be updated.

But we do have some time limit saying, you know, if the sign isn't installed within six months following issuance of the permit or within 30 days of the temporary sign permit, it will be void. And so you would have to resubmit.

Some more permit requirements -- oh, that's a double. Skip that.

Some just general regulations for all signs. Signs can't be placed so that they would endanger pedestrians, cyclists or profit or interfere with street signs or view. They

can be double-sided.

We do have specific sign illumination standards that are more spelled out with the actual text, electrical supply standards, and glare control as well.

Signs in the Residential and Conservation Districts, permitted signs may be located anywhere on the premises except the required side setback or within 10 feet of the required right-of-way.

Wall signs must be flush-mounted. It can't be projected on the roof or mounted on the roof. And billboards off premises advertising signs are prohibited in the Residential and Conservation Districts, which is currently what we stated.

This is just, you know, a brief table going over what type of sign is permitted in the Residential and Conservation Districts, the size, what type of use it could be used for, and any additional regulations.

Signs in the C-1, C-3, and C4

District, which are three of the four

Commercial Districts, pretty much the same.

And we do have a table here kind of outlining

how many signs that are permitted, what type of sign for each use, and any additional regulations.

And our current regulations are that billboards are also prohibited in C-1, C-3, and C4. So we are keeping that here as well.

Signs in the C-2 and M District.

This is the General Commercial District and the Manufacturing and Light Industrial. Any signs permitted in R Districts are permitted in the C-2 and M.

You know, we have the standards here, you know, depending on what type of sign, type of use, how many of each. And this is when billboards are permitted as a conditional use.

So just a closer look at the billboards. They may be electronic message center signs, meaning they'd be digital. They can have two -- more than two faces or structures that would be V-shaped -- or, I'm sorry, they cannot be V-shaped. So they would just be back to back, you know, double-sided.

They cannot exceed 100 square feet per face. They cannot exceed the length of

25 feet or a height of 12 feet. And that does not include supports or structures.

Like I said, these are only permitted as conditional uses in the C-2 and M District, which is what our current standards are in our existing language.

EMCs, the electronic message centers, we do have specific regulations here. I'm not going to read through all of them.

But in our current language, you know, EMCs were still very new at that time. So we will have new regulations to keep up with the digital age.

Political signs, right now, we just have some, you know, surface language, that they should not be erected more than 45 days prior to the election in which the community is pursuing, and shall be removed within 15 days after election for which it was erected.

It shall be limited to one sign per candidate per adjacent parcel when placing in public right-of-way or on public property.

And political signs shall not be installed as to limited site distance or create any safety hazards for pedestrians or cyclists.

1 Nonconforming signs. We just added some very general language that is consistent 3 with the Municipalities Planning Code. Just 4 if a sign is already existing and was nonconforming, it just goes over the regulations for altering or removing the sign, 7 how you can update the sign if there's damage, destruction or needs replaced, sign 8 9 abandonment, and then the health, safety and welfare of nonconforming signs as well.

We also added some appendices. This is probably my favorite part of the whole update just because it gives everyone, you know, easy references.

So the first one is Appendix A, where we added sign measurement graphics. As you can see, they're below. They show how to measure the sign area, the difference between sign face, and the sign supporting structure or base, and then how to measure the sign height.

So, you know, there's a lot of confusion just because a lot of the municipalities have other regulations of how they do it. So I just thought, you know,

including these graphics would make it much
more user friendly.

And then Appendix B for this, we included sign type example pictures for every defined sign. We have in this amendment. So if you're questioning what an animated or moving sign example is, you can go right to Appendix B and scroll down and it will have, you know, one or two pictures of, you know, what type of sign that is. The same with, you know, billboards, any type of sign.

So now what? Next Steps. Council can consider the amendment at their 9/12 regular meeting. If they choose to adopt it, adopt this amendment, it would be sent to the county, and it would become effective 30 days after adoption or after -- (indiscernible).

PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much. That's a lot of information.

Hi, my name is Lori Wasko. 8 I live at 4533 Mollenauer Street in 9 10 Bethel Park. 11 Is that all you need? 12 PRESIDENT MOURY: That's fine. 13 MS. WASKO: I've been there for my 14 whole life in Bethel Park. And I oppose the 15 erection of the digital billboards in our 16 community due to it taking away from the 17 beautification of the streetscape, the 18 beautification of our community. 19 These brightly lit signs are a nuisance. They could cause distracted 20 21 driving, and that's a danger to all of us. 2.2 There are many studies on this. 2.3 It's an extremely bright sign,

especially at night. And this would be

directly across the street, eye level of my

- home and many others along Mollenauer Street.

  And none of us on the street, all my neighbors

  that we've spoken to, are wanting this type of

  sign in our community.
  - Plus, digital billboards are just plain ugly. I'm sure you've seen them around. And you get one of these up in our community, and they'll end up being on every corner from one end of Bethel Park to the other.
    - We don't need to watch commercials on that dangerous bend. Route 88 along Hillside Drive, along that bend, it is one of the most dangerous bends in Bethel Park for driving. There's accidents. We hear screeching all the time with the traffic signal there.
    - And I'd just please ask that you consider not to approve this amendment for these digital billboards. Thank you.
